Start the tour at **»West Gate«**. To which building did it belong originally? **The Westgate was part of the old city wall.**

Follow the **High Street** and look for the **river**. What is the name of the river? **River Stour o. Great Stour**



On the right side of your path is a house called **»The Old Weavers«**. When was it built? **AD 1500, 1500**



What are the **»Canterbury Tales**«? Where do you find them? **»Canterbury Tales**« is an attraction in St. Margaret's Street. As visitors walk through a medieval house, they are told stories of the famous English author Chaucer.



Go to the **»Tower«** in **St. George's Street.** Who was baptised there? **On a blackboard on the wall is a note that the English poet Christopher Marlowe was baptized on 26th of February 1564 in this church.**

Continue on **Canterbury Lane** to **Burgate Lane**. Here is another historical building with the **house number 58**. What is the name of the building? A Roman Catholic church

What **imposing building** with an entrance gate – decorated by many coat of arms – is located at the **Butter Market?** The Canterbury Cathedral



During your tour you will often read the name **»Thomas Beckett«**. Who was Thomas Beckett?

Thomas Beckett was archbishop of Canterbury. He was murdered in the cathedral – on the order of Henry II on 29th of December 1170. Thomas Beckett became a martyr. Thousands of pilgrims came to the city.
